A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE APPROVING THE FY2023 CITYWIDE CRACK SEAL PROJECT (OM2301); AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONSTRUCTION CONTRACT WITH PAVEMENT COATINGS CO. FOR THE FY2023 CITYWIDE CRACK SEAL PROJECT (OM2301) IN THE AMOUNT OF \$617,565.94; AUTHORIZING THE CITY ENGINEER TO APPROVE CHANGE ORDERS NOT-TO-EXCEED \$61,756 (CEQA EXEMPT)

WHEREAS, the FY2023 Citywide Crack Seal Project (OM2301) (Project) includes placing crack seal treatment on various streets throughout the City and streets included are listed in the Project Location Map; and

WHEREAS, an invitation to bid was duly advertised on August 19, 2022 and August 26, 2022, and electronic bids were received on September 8, 2022; and

WHEREAS, Pavement Coatings Co. was determined to be the responsible bidder submitting the lowest responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, Global Road Sealing, Inc. was determined to be the responsible bidder submitting the second lowest responsive bid; and

WHEREAS, the Project is a project under California Environmental Quality Act (Section 21000 et seq. of the Public Resources Code, hereinafter referred to as CEQA) which requires that cities consider the environmental consequences of their actions before approving a project; and

WHEREAS, Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) of the State CEQA Guidelines (Chapter 3 of Division 6 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations) provides an exemption from CEQA for projects involving the minor alteration of existing public or private facilities when the alteration involves negligible or no expansion of an existing use. As the Project involves maintenance activities to existing infrastructure and will involve negligible or no expansion of use, it qualifies for the identified exemption and no additional environmental review under CEQA is required.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby:

 Finds the FY2023 Citywide Crack Seal Project (OM2301) exempt from the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA) pursuant to Section 15301 (existing facilities) of the State CEQA Guidelines based upon the following finding:

Section 15301 (Existing Facilities) of the State CEQA Guidelines (Chapter 3 of Division 6 of Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations) provides an exemption from CEQA for projects involving the minor alteration of existing public or private facilities when the alteration involves negligible or no expansion of an existing use. This Project involves placing crack seal treatment on various streets throughout the City and does not involve any expansion of use, it qualifies for the identified exemption and no additional environmental review under CEQA is required; and

- 2) Approves the Project; and
- 3) Authorizes the City Manager to execute a construction contract with Pavement Coatings Co. for the FY2023 Citywide Crack Seal Project (OM2301) in the amount of \$617,565.94 upon receipt of all required bonds and insurance and the approval of such bonds and insurance by the City Attorney; and
- 4) Authorizes the City Engineer to approve change orders not-to-exceed \$61,756.
