Councilmembers:

As a member of the Sacramento Area Beekeepers Association I am in support of the amendments to beekeeping within the City of Elk Grove. I feel it has been beneficial to the City by allowing any resident follow best bee practices to assist the bee population. As we know, bee populations around the world have suffered from colony collapse disorder. Urban beekeeping, or as I like to say backyard beekeeping, is important because it contributes to the efforts to increase bee populations. Contrary to what one might expect, bees survive better in the urban environment, produce more honey, and are typically healthier than their rural bee counterparts. Backyard beekeeping allows for better pollination of those residential flowers, plants, and trees within about a 3 mile area of the backyard colony. Among the million or so beekeepers scattered around the world, the largest share of them are amateur beekeepers such as myself. I don't want this hobby to die, and the bees along with it. I would like to wrap this up by saying the amended sections allow for the municipal code to fall in line with past practices as allowed by the City and this council. The City has been a strong supporter of backyard beekeeping and the amended changes should be approved.

I will let you know that Map 1 is not being recommended by staff to move forward, one issue is the factor of the population disparity between the largest and smallest district, but another concern is the amount of displacement to voters the map creates. In particular, for Map 1 the Green District would likely become District 3, if that was the case, those former voters in District 2 would have to wait until 2024 to vote for their district representative. Under Map 1, District 2 would likely become the Teal colored district to the south.

Hi,

Thanks for the meeting invitation for the in-person meeting tonight. I'm unable to come, but if a vote is taken or a straw poll please register my choice as being Map-01 11387102-2002.

Also please note that I am very much opposed to including the new city annexation in a district shown on one of the maps which includes the rural area residents. The Kabota Factory relative to water use for potential manufacturing not disclosed or included in the GSP for the SASb, or discussed at any public engagement meetings or board meetings of OHWD.

The City site also remains within the Omochumne-Hartnell Water District boundaries. There has been a lack of disclosure to ag res in the OHWD regarding assessments by OHWD to fund activity on this site and/or water for manufacturing potentially to be used at the site. There is also the potential public/private ownership and issues relative to potential recycled water which have not been disclosed to ag res in the district nor the general public

Any redistricting map including this Kabota Factory in the rural Area should be rejected.

Mayor, Vice Mayor, and Council Members,

Since the publishing of the staff report at 2 p.m. on March 4, 2022, four (4) district map submittals were posted on the DistrctR site.


The submitted maps and accompanying staff evaluations are attached to this memo.

Map 15 holds several similarities with Map 11, but the inclusion of areas east of Elk Grove-Florin Road into District 3 raise some concern of voter displacement.

Maps 16 and 18 hold concerns like those of the category 2 staff recommendation of maps proposing thematic changes that often display issues with state regulations (Contiguous, Communities of Interest, Clear Borders, and Compact) and created increased electoral disruptions.

Map 17 holds several similarities with Map 12, but raises some concern of voter displacement by switching a north/south boundary of Elk Grove-Florin Road with the rail line.




▼ Voting Age Population by Race




Map 18 Northern Balance 117587 03-07-2022




▼ Voting Age Population by Race COMPARE Asian VAP


Since the last staff memo distribution, three (3) district map submittals were submitted, one on the DistrctR site and two sent direct to City Staff. The total number of maps submitted to date is 21.


The submitted maps and accompanying staff evaluations are attached to this memo.

Map 19 and 21 appear to be the same submittal with a slight change in Map 21. Map 19 would not meet the population balance requirements. Both maps have a similar layout as Map 4, but Map 21 (and Map 19) hold concerns like those of the category 2 staff recommendation of maps proposing thematic changes that create increased electoral disruptions (in particular the inclusion of former District 2 areas east of Elk Grove-Florin Road).

Map 20 holds concerns like those of the category 2 staff recommendation of maps proposing thematic changes that often display issues with state regulations (in particular Clear Borders for this submittal) and creates increased electoral disruptions.








COMPARE Asian VAP
