

RESOLUTION NO. 2019-162

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE SETTING FEES TO BE COLLECTED FROM SMALL QUANTITY GENERATORS OF HAZARDOUS WASTE TO COVER THE COST OF HANDLING AND DISPOSING HAZARDOUS WASTE AT THE SPECIAL WASTE COLLECTION CENTER AND AUTHORIZING AN ANNUAL ESCALATION OF THESE FEES BASED UPON THE INFLATIONARY ADJUSTMENT METHODOLOGY SPECIFIED IN THE DISPOSAL CONTRACT FOR EACH WASTE TYPE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Elk Grove constructed the Special Waste Collection Center (SWCC) for the proper disposal of typical household hazardous waste from residents and Small Quantity Generators (SQGs); and

WHEREAS, the SQG program offered at the SWCC is designed to allow qualifying businesses an affordable solution for hazardous waste disposal; and

WHEREAS, a disposal fee schedule for the SQG program was established in 2013 by Resolution No. 2013-226 and has not been updated since that time to reflect actual disposal costs; and

WHEREAS, disposal costs for waste received from SQGs have increased due to inflationary increases in labor and disposal rates and therefore, the current SQG disposal fees are insufficient to cover the actual cost of handling and disposal; and

WHEREAS, waste disposal costs will continue to increase due to annual adjustments to labor and disposal costs prescribed within the City's contracts with its various transportation and disposal vendors; and

WHEREAS, to ensure that SQGs are paying disposal fees that accurately reflect the total cost to the City for the handling and disposal of SQG's hazardous waste, the SQG Disposal Fee Schedule should be adjusted annually to reflect the cost increases the City is subject to within the contracts with its various transportation and disposal vendors; and

WHEREAS, because the City Council wishes to encourage proper disposal of hazardous waste, the revenue received from the franchise fees paid by Registered Commercial Haulers in Elk Grove shall be used to offset the administrative cost for businesses located within Elk Grove and thus the Administrative Fee shall be waived for all SQGs located within the boundaries of Elk Grove; and

WHEREAS, this application of the Commercial Refuse Hauler fees will serve to assist in the implementation of solid waste programs required by law, including, but not limited to, household hazard waste disposal requirements, will serve to mitigate the infrastructure impacts related to solid waste program implementation, and protect and promote the public health and welfare with respect to solid waste.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council that the fees shown on the attached Exhibit A shall be effective August 1, 2019, and shall be charged at the SWCC for all SQG materials collected for disposal and those businesses located within Elk Grove shall have the Administrative Fee waived.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the City Council authorizes an annual adjustment to the SQG Disposal Fees shown in Exhibit A pursuant to changes in actual costs incurred and calculated in accordance with the methodology used to calculate inflationary adjustments to the labor, disposal, or other costs detailed in the applicable contract for each waste type, except that the annual increase shall not exceed four percent (4%) of the current year's fee amount.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, the City Council delegates authority to the City Manager to remove hazardous material types and applicable fees shown on the attached Exhibit A pursuant to changed regulations.
