

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-186

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE DISPENSING WITH THE FORMAL BIDDING PROCEDURE PURSUANT TO ELK GROVE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 3.42.180(B)(3) AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE A CONTRACT WITH ELK GROVE-F, INC., A CALIFORNIA CORPORATION DBA ELK GROVE FORD FOR THE PURCHASE OF THREE REPLACEMENT VEHICLES AND ONE ADDITIONAL POLICE VEHICLE IN AN AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$170,000 WITH AN OPTION TO PURCHASE AN ADDITIONAL THREE POLICE VEHICLES FOR A TOTAL CONTRACT AMOUNT NOT-TO-EXCEED \$295,500

WHEREAS, the City of Elk Grove's Fleet division maintains all City vehicles and procures replacements when necessary; and

WHEREAS, the City's Fleet division has identified three police vehicles that have reached the end of their useful life of City service; and

WHEREAS, the Elk Grove Police Department has increased its School Resource Officer staffing level by one sworn officer this fiscal year, which requires one additional patrol vehicle to be added to the fleet; and

WHEREAS, the State of California opened a competitive bidding process for the purchase of police patrol utility vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Elk Grove-F Inc., a California Corporation dba Elk Grove Ford (Elk Grove Ford) has been asked to match the prices of the state-issued contract so the vehicles may be purchased in Elk Grove; and

WHEREAS, Elk Grove Ford agreed to match the prices posted in the State of California's large quantity contract award, which was competitively bid, thus the City is receiving a competitive price; the expenditures of staff time and money to compile the necessary bid documents for a small number of vehicles will not likely result in a better price or an outcome more advantageous to the City; and Elk Grove Ford is located within the City of Elk Grove and therefore one percent of every taxable sale will return to the City; and

WHEREAS, for the reasons presented, it is not in the best interest of the City to conduct formal bidding for the purchase of the subject vehicles; and

WHEREAS, Fleet Services and the Police Department have sufficient funding identified in the 2022-23 fiscal year operating budget for this purchase.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby finds that a formal bidding procedure for the subject vehicles is not in the best interest of the City and hereby dispenses with the formal bidding procedure pursuant to Elk Grove Municipal Code Section 3.42.180(B)(3) for the purchase of the subject vehicles; and


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute a contract with Elk Grove-F, Inc., a California corporation doing business as Elk Grove Ford, in substantially the form presented, for the purchase of four Ford police patrol interceptor utility vehicles in an amount not-to-exceed \$170,000, with an option, in the City Manager's discretion, to purchase an additional three vehicles for a total compensation amount not-to-exceed \$295,500.
