(C) Designated Recyclable Green Waste Includes but is not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● green waste including yard and garden waste, grass clippings, leaves, weeds, brush, straw, tree and branch trimmings or other prunings or clippings, and non-hazardous wood waste 		x		x
(D) Designated Recyclable Food Waste Includes but is not limited to: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● food material acquired for animal or human consumption and is expired, unwanted, or otherwise unusable ● food-soiled paper such as napkins, paper towels, paper food wrappers, paper plates and cups, used pizza boxes 				x
