

Transparent Artwork in the Old Town Elk Grove Library

Questions / Answers

- 1. Question: Is the work to be hung inside the window on the interior of the Library? (April 22, 2008)**

Answer: The Public Art shall be transparent artwork that will be installed inside, on, in front of or behind the south facing second floor windows. The artwork could be hung inside the window.

- 2. Question: I notice in the photos that there is a framed wall in the center of one of the windows, will that be there or is that temporary? (April 22, 2008)**

Answer: In Attachment B of the RFP, the first photo, shows a framed wall in the center of the right window. That current wall configuration is temporary and will be shortened considerably to not be a visible deterrent to the artwork.

- 3. Are the mullions in the windows on the inside or outside? And are they permanent or removable? Painted or plastic? And do you know if the glass in the windows has some UV filter, is double pane, etc. (May 2, 2008)**

Answer: There are two manufactured nail-on aluminum windows units 5' wide by 6' high. These are combined in one window opening with a wood 4X6 separating them so the effect is to have approximately a 10'+ wide by 6' high window. The units have a double glazing with what looks like a shading - UV coating – but we do not have documentation to determine precise information. The mullions are on the outside of the glass and are part of the window. They do not appear removable and are part of the design approved by the Old Town association so that, if removable, any proposal to remove would need to at least go through that process.
