The Dickens Faire will take place on Saturday, November 29, from 9:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. The holiday celebration will feature period costumes, arts and crafts, and a variety of foods, music and more. The event will also include carriage rides, pony rides, entertainment and a visit from Santa Clause.

“The annual Dickens Faire is a cherished tradition in our community that provides a unique opportunity to visit a true gem in our city,” said Mayor Gary Davis. “Come on down, join the fun and get in the holiday spirit in Old Town Elk Grove.”

Following the Dickens Faire, festival goers can enjoy the annual parade of lights and a festive tree lighting ceremony.

Admission is free and those attending will have plenty of room to walk freely as Elk Grove Boulevard will be closed to traffic between School Street and 2nd Avenue from 7:00 a.m. until 6:00 p.m.
