### **Grant Line 99 Interchange Nominated for Interchange Project of the Year**

Elk Grove, CA – The City of Elk Grove announced today the Grant Line 99 Interchange Project has been nominated as an Interchange Project of the Year finalist by the California Transportation Foundation, a statewide nonprofit organization representing California's transportation community.

The California Transportation Foundation will announce the TRANNY Award winners at the annual awards ceremony and luncheon on June 3 at the Sacramento Convention Center.

"The TRANNY Awards jury, made up of public and private sector transportation professionals, reviewed many excellent nominations this year," said Linda Bohlinger, CTF Chair. "Our selections represent the best of the projects, programs and people who made a positive difference for California transportation in 2008."

The Grant Line Interchange Project, an \$83 million capital improvement project funded 100 percent by local dollars, replaced one of the oldest interchanges on Highway 99. It is the first project to be constructed in the New Measure A transportation sales tax program. The new six-lane interchange now provides safer freeway access, improves local and regional traffic flow, and serves as an economic development asset for existing and future businesses in the southern part of the City.

“The City of Elk Grove is thrilled that of all the infrastructure projects completed in California during 2008, the Grant Line Interchange stood out as one of the best,” said Mayor Pat Hume. “It is an honor to be nominated, but the accolades go to the staff and contractors who made this project happen. It is because of them that our residents have already won.”
