#### **RESOLUTION NO. 2007-55**

# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE ESTABLISHING AND DEFINING THE SCOPE OF THE CHARTER EXPLORATORY AND ELECTION REFORM COMMITTEE

**WHEREAS**, the Council has provided direction to establish an exploratory committee to consider the Charter City vs. General Law forms of government and to review election reform issues.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove establishes the scope and characteristics of the Committee as set forth herein:

### Section 1: Specific Tasks or Objectives

- 1. Research and enumerate the advantages and disadvantages of the General Law vs. the City Charter forms of government.
- 2. Study election reform issues:
  - a. Election/selection of the Mayor
  - b. District Elections
  - c. Instant run-off voting (ranked-choice voting)
  - d. Election by 50% plus one
  - e. Primary/general elections
  - f. Campaign finance reform

#### Section 2: Committee Type. Ad-hoc

Section 3: Composition. The Committee shall consist of five members.

<u>Section 4:</u> Qualifications. Each member of the Committee must be at least 18 years of age, reside in the City, and be registered to vote. *A member may not be an officer or employee of the City.* 

<u>Section 5.</u> Appointment and <u>Term.</u> Each member of the City Council shall appoint one member to the Committee. *Each member shall serve at the pleasure of his or her appointing Councilmember. Committee members are not required to live in the district represented by the appointing <i>Councilmember.* The Committee will sunset 6 months after appointment of all Committee members.

Section 6: Support to the Committee. Staff support shall be provided to the Committee as determined appropriate by the City Manager. Professional facilitator services shall be provided by Lucy & Co.

<u>Section 7: Meetings.</u> The Committee shall meet on a date and time selected by the members of the Committee. *The meetings shall be noticed pursuant to the Brown Act.* 

<u>Section 8: Reporting.</u> Minutes of the Committee shall be prepared by staff designated by the City Manager and shall be a public record, filed with the City Clerk.

<u>Section 9:</u> Funding. The Committee's total expenditures shall not exceed \$75,000 without the approval of the City Council.
