# A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE AUTHORIZING THE SACRAMENTO MUNICIPAL UTILITY DISTRICT TO APPLY FOR STATE ENERGY PROGRAM FUNDS FROM THE CALIFORNIA ENERGY COMMISSION ON BEHALF OF THE CITY AND ITS RESIDENTS

WHEREAS, the City of Elk Grove (the "City") recognizes that it is in the interest of the regional, state, and national economy to stimulate the economy; create and retain jobs; reduce fossil fuel emissions; and reduce total energy usage and improve energy efficiency within our jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) funds are available through the California Energy Commission's EECBG Program for grants to eligible local governments for cost-effective energy efficiency projects; and

**WHEREAS**, the EECBG Program allows for public agencies or non-profit entities to apply for EECBG funds on behalf of eligible local governments; and

**WHEREAS**, the City is eligible for EECBG funding under the California Energy Commission's EECBG Program; and

WHEREAS, the City is proposing to collaborate with the Sacramento Municipal Utility District ("SMUD") to implement the energy efficiency project/s described in Exhibit A for the purpose of qualifying for EECBG funds from the California Energy Commission; and

WHEREAS, the City has considered the application of the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") to the approval of the energy efficiency project/s described in Exhibit A.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that in compliance with CEQA, the City Council of the City of Elk Grove accepts SMUD's findings, described in Exhibit B, that the approval of the energy efficiency project/s described in Exhibit A is a "project" under CEQA that is exempt under CCR Class 1A (§15301) & Class 22A (§15322), because the program affects existing facilities and educational or training programs involve no physical changes.

- 1) That the City authorizes SMUD to submit a collaborative application on its behalf to the California Energy Commission for the energy efficiency project/s described in Exhibit A.
- 2) If recommended for funding by the California Energy Commission, the City authorizes SMUD to accept a grant award on its behalf and to enter into all necessary contracts and agreements, and amendments thereto, on its behalf to implement and carry out the project/s described in Exhibit A.

### **EXHIBIT A**

The Sacramento Municipal Utility District ("SMUD") on behalf of the Sacramento Regional Energy Alliance ("SREA"), is seeking \$17,000,000 in State Energy Program grant funding to support the expansion of its Home Performance Program ("HPP").

SMUD has budgeted and planned the implementation of a contractor model HPP with Energy Star qualified rebates program to start in January, 2010, targeting 1,024 homes over two years. SEP funding will enable SMUD and the SREA to transform the planned niche program into a much more accessible program, retrofitting and/or providing Home Energy Rating System Phase II audits to 17,650 homes through the following strategic approaches:

- Removal of customer and contractor participation barriers and development of a comprehensive marketing plan to garner 5% program market penetration in two years.
- Leverage of AB811 property tax based financing and marketing.
- Working with a Building America Grant recipient to implement a neighborhood approach to home retrofits, testing energy efficiency packages at volumediscount prices.
- Piloting a comprehensive multi-family retrofit model, providing escalating performance-based incentives to overcome owner-tenant barriers.
- Establishing a sustainable market for home energy ratings and evaluations in existing homes under the new Home Energy Rating System II ("HERSII") regulations.
- Improving the quality of installations for Community Resource Project ("CRP")
  low-income weatherized homes and Sacramento Housing Redevelopment
  Agency ("SHRA") Neighborhood Stabilization Program moderate-low income
  renovated foreclosed homes by providing HERSII audits and rating.
- Coordination with Los Rios Community College District ("LRCCD") to develop a SMUD green academy, training contractors in auditing, building performance science and more.

The team includes members of the SREA consortia, formed to improve energy efficiency and solar in our region and develop unified approaches to economic recovery and job creation. SREA consist of SMUD, County of Sacramento, Cities of Elk Grove, Sacramento, Rancho Cordova, Citrus Heights, Folsom and Galt, LRCCD, Sacramento Employment and Training Agency, CRP, SHRA, Pacific Gas & Electric and Valley Vision. SMUD is the lead for this application with funds intended to be sub granted to California Building Performance Contractors Association ("CBPCA"), CRP and Build it Green ("BIG"). The Cities of Elk Grove, Sacramento, and Folsom, as well as the County of Sacramento have contributed to this proposal through Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant ("EECBG") funds. All partners in the consortia will participate in promotion and marketing of the HPP. The consortia and this proposal are supported by the California Air Resources Board and the Sacramento Area Council of Governments.

Major anticipated impacts include the development of 185 new jobs. Training programs will focus on contractors and construction workers, the workforce hit the hardest by the economic downturn and housing crisis. The Program will save energy, including peak hour usage, and reduce GHG emissions.

Below is a list of local governments collaborating with SMUD, the dollar amount of their respective grant contributions to the HPP, and any in-kind services committed to the program. The lead collaborative entity for this application, as previously noted is SMUD on behalf of the SREA.
