The Trails Committee will review and provide input to staff regarding design features of projects as it pertains to the City's Bicycle, Pedestrian and Trails Master Plan.

5.1 STATHOS SELF STORAGE (PLNG21-053)

The proposed Project located on two vacant parcels totaling 8.55 acres on the north side of Elk Grove Boulevard between Bruceville Road and Foulks Ranch Drive (APNs: 116-0061-042 and 116-0061-010) consists of a new, \pm 159,106 square-foot personal storage facility and associated site improvements. The Project includes a Modification to the City's Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Trails Master Plan. A Class 1 multiuse trail is proposed to run north-south through the Project site from Elk Grove Boulevard to Kilconnell Drive. The Project proposes to provide a 14-foot-wide Class 1 multi-use path within the Project's 25-foot building setback and landscape area to provide a connection from Elk Grove Boulevard to Tarbert Drive. *Recommendation:* Review the project proposal and provide feedback to staff.

Location: North side of Elk Grove Boulevard, 1600 feet west of Bruceville Road

INTRODUCTION / BACKGROUND:

The proposed Project is located on two vacant parcels totaling 8.55 acres on the north side of Elk Grove Boulevard between Bruceville Road and Foulks Ranch Drive (APNs: 116-0061-042 and 116-0061-010). The Applicant proposes a General Plan Amendment from Low Density Residential (LDR) to Community Commercial (CC); a corresponding Rezone from RD-5 to General Commercial (GC); and a Conditional Use Permit and Major Design Review for a new, approximately 159,106 square-foot personal storage facility and associated site improvements. The Project includes a Modification to the City's Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Trails Master Plan.

As depicted in Figure 12 of the City of Elk Grove's Bicycle, Pedestrian, and Trails Master Plan (BPTMP), a Class 1 multi-use trail is proposed to run north-south through the Project site from Elk Grove Boulevard to Kilconnell Drive.

The Project proposes to provide a 14-foot-wide Class 1 multi-use path within the Project's 25-foot building setback and landscape area to provide a connection from Elk Grove Boulevard to Tarbert Drive as shown in red in Figure 2. The proposed trail section would include a 10-foot paved trail with 2-feet of decomposed granite (DG). There is an existing 7-foot Irrevocable Offer of Dedication (IOD) on the adjacent parcel to the east (Carlton Senior Living) that could be utilized for the trail corridor. The City Council previously determined (in 2014) that a trail connection directly to Kilconnell Drive was not feasible due to the existing development of the Good Shepherd Church immediately north of the Project site.

Staff recommendation:

City Staff would like feedback from the Trails Committee on the Applicant's proposed development as it pertains to implementing the City's bicycle and trails requirements.
