A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ELK GROVE DISPENSING WITH THE FORMAL REQUEST FOR PROPOSAL PROCEDURE PURSUANT TO ELK GROVE MUNICIPAL CODE SECTION 3.42.188(B)(3) AND AUTHORIZING THE CITY MANAGER TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH THE COUNTY OF SACRAMENTO FOR THE CITY'S PROPORTIONATE SHARE OF HAZARDOUS MATERIALS EMERGENCY RESPONSE SERVICES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$131,505.69 FOR FISCAL YEAR 2023-24 WITH THE OPTION TO EXTEND THE TERM OF THE AGREEMENT FOR UP TO ONE YEAR IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$135,450.85, WITH THE TOTAL TWO-YEAR COST OF THE AGREEMENT IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$266,956.54

- **WHEREAS**, the City of Elk Grove does not have the ability to perform Level II and Level III hazardous materials response; and
- **WHEREAS**, the County of Sacramento has requested the City of Elk Grove pay its proportionate share of costs related to hazardous materials response services within the incorporated limits of Elk Grove; and
- **WHEREAS**, the County of Sacramento has separate agreements directly with the City of Sacramento Fire Department and the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District for these services; and
- **WHEREAS**, the term of the City's prior agreement with the County of Sacramento for these hazardous materials response services expired on June 30, 2023; and
- **WHEREAS**, the County of Sacramento, through the City of Sacramento Fire Department and the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District, has been providing the City with hazardous materials response services since July 1, 2023 without a formal agreement; and
- **WHEREAS**, the City Council finds it appropriate to enter into an agreement for services provided and to be provided by the County of Sacramento, through the City of Sacramento Fire Department and the Sacramento Metropolitan Fire District from July 1, 2023 through June 30, 2024 with the optional one-year extension, and to pay for such services that have been provided to the City in good faith; and
- **WHEREAS**, for the reasons presented, it is not in the best interest of the City to conduct a formal request for proposal process for hazardous materials emergency response services.
- **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City Council of the City of Elk Grove hereby determines that the formal request for proposal procedure is not in the best interest of the City and hereby dispenses with the formal process pursuant to Elk Grove Municipal Code Section 3.42.188(B)(3); and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the City Manager is hereby authorized to execute an agreement with the County of Sacramento, in substantially the form presented, for hazardous materials response services in an amount not to exceed \$131,505.69 with the option to extend the term of the agreement for up to one year in the amount of \$135,450.85; for a total two-year cost of the agreement not to exceed \$266,956.54.
