

UPDATED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS FOR REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS BOND ROAD MURAL

Dated June 13, 2023

Q1. I would like to clarify the wall dimensions. The proposal indicates 27'x 171' and 35'x 171'. The wall height appears to be lower than 27' and 35' from the provided photographs. Please let me know if the measurements are up-to-date and if any additional/ongoing construction will occur to alter the photographed spaces.

A1. The measurements are up to date and no additional work is planned for these areas. The wall does taper in some areas, but we used the tallest heights of the wall in the RFP to ensure the artist could plan for the tallest points.

Q2. I have a question regarding the measurements. The RFP says "The south wall is 27' wide and 171' in length. The north wall is approximately 35' wide and 171' in length."

I want to confirm that the south wall is in fact, 27 *inches* wide/tall not 27 *feet* wide/tall, and the north wall is 35 *inches* wide/tall <u>not</u> 35 *feet* wide/tall, as indicated in the RFP.

A2. You're correct – the measurements are in inches, not feet. We apologize for the typo.

Q3. If we are applying as a team, we only need to submit one joint application, correct?

A3. Yes, you would only need to submit one application if you're applying as a team. You should include information on each team member in the application, so their experiences are considered by the Review Panel.

Q4. I have a question about this request for proposals. I do not see on the requirements what class of state contractor's license is required for this bid California state law clearly requires any government agency to state what class of license is required. Can you add this in for all to see, as required by state law please:

Professions Code §7059(b) and Public Contract Code §3300(a)). Public Contract Code §3300(a) provides: "Any public entity...shall specify the classification of the contractor's license which a contractor shall possess at the time a contract is awarded. The specification shall be included in any plans prepared for a public project and in any notice inviting bids required pursuant to this code." Business and Professions Code §7059(b) provides: "[i]n public works contracts, as defined

in Section 1101 of the Public Contract Code, the awarding authority shall determine the license classification necessary to bid and perform the project." A4. The City has not listed a contractor's license requirement because this is not a Public Works project that is provided to the lowest bidder. This is the commissioning of art. In this case a mural along Bond Road. The City's Art Commission will provide a recommendation on an artist, but it is not a low bid situation. There are many kinds of art that the City commissions. This one happens to be along a Public Work (Bond Road). We do publish the request for artists along a wide variety of publications including those that would attract licensed contractors and a licensed contractor certainly could also be an artist. But the licensed contractor wouldn't need to furnish their license to provide the City with art.
