Summary

The National Citizen Survey™ (The NCS™) is a collaborative effort between National Research Center, Inc. (NRC) and the International City/County Management Association (ICMA). The survey and its administration are standardized to assure high quality research methods and directly comparable results across The NCS communities. This report includes the verbatim responses to an open ended question included on The NCS 2015 survey for Elk Grove. Additional reports and the technical appendices are available under separate cover.


Respondents were asked to record their opinions about Elk Grove in the following question:

• In your own words, what one thing do you love most about Elk Grove?

The verbatim responses were categorized by topic area and those topics are reported in the following chart with the percent of responses given in each category. Because some comments from residents covered more than a single topic, those verbatim responses are grouped by the first topic listed in each comment whenever a respondent mentioned more than a single topic.

Results from the open-ended question are best understood by reviewing the frequencies that summarize responses as well as the actual verbatim responses themselves. A total of 275 surveys were completed by Elk Grove residents; of these, 198 respondents wrote in responses for the open-ended question. About one-quarter of residents made a comment relating to Elk Grove's small-town feel, the quietness or rurality of Elk Grove, or the sense of community, diversity or culture of the City. About 2 in 10 residents mentioned aspects of raising children in Elk Grove, including the quality of schools or family-friendliness of the community. About 1 in 10 residents commented on the safety and/or the quality of police services, and a similar proportion mentioned the ease of access to community amenities such as shopping opportunities or restaurants. Less than 1 in 10 residents cited overall beauty/trees/cleanliness, parks/recreation and community events or the location of the City as the thing they loved most about Elk Grove. About 13% of respondents either made a broad comment about living in Elk Grove or commented on an aspect of Elk Grove outside of the established categories.
